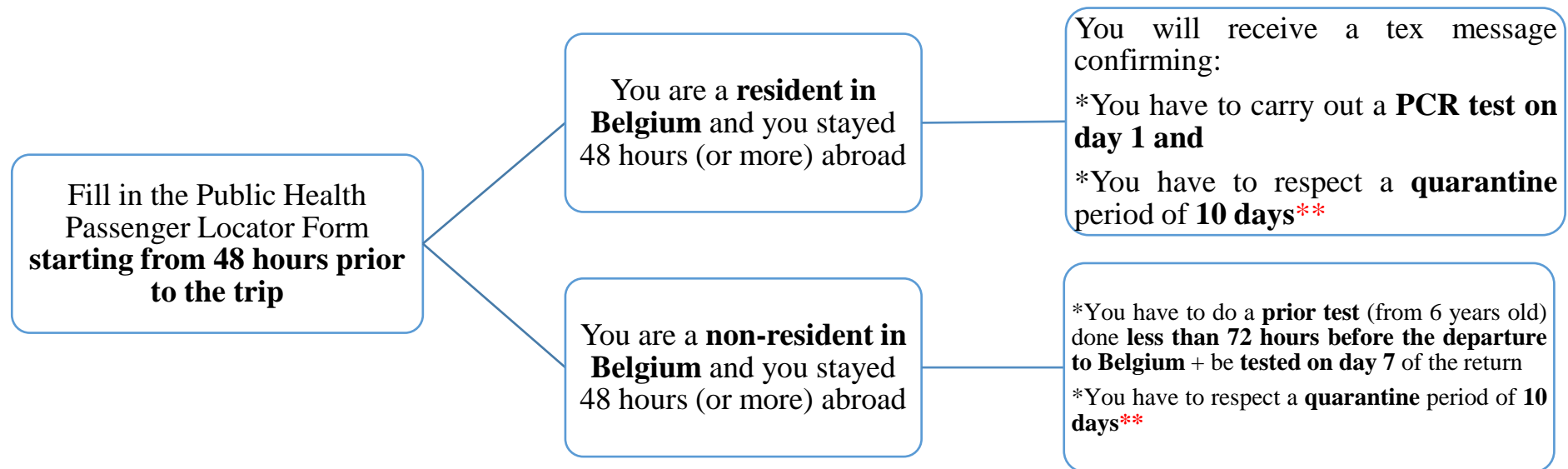


## Communication for all travelers travelling to Belgium from the UK, South Africa or South America



**N.B. :** \*\* The quarantine may be waived temporarily to perform an essential function or to meet the essential need of the trip, if that activity cannot be postponed.

We remind you that you can find:

An uninterrupted source (24 hours a day, 7 days a week) providing the collection, analysis and publication of all kinds of urgent information for the relevant authorities ;
